

ROXANNE

FINISHED QUILT TOP: 58½" X 68½"
FINISHED BLOCK UNITS: 10" SQUARE

Curvy and sassy, a scrap quilt like Roxanne gets noticed.

MATERIALS

- Assorted prints in fat quarters*, fat eighths**, or scraps—totaling 2 yards
- ¾ yards dark solid
- ⅔ yards peach solid
- ¾ yards backing fabric
- 11" square of template plastic for Block unit
- 3½" x 11" rectangle of template plastic for Melon
- 66" x 76" rectangle of batting

*fat quarter = 18" x 22"

**fat eighth = 9" x 22"

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Give a simple Nine Patch the curved seam treatment and create your own version of Roxanne, a sassy scrap quilt made in the 1940s.



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CUTTING

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Cut strips across width of fabric (WOF). These instructions are written for all Block units to be made using dark solid fabrics for the center and corners—and prints for the four side pieces. Yardage is sufficient if you wish to mix up the fabrics as the quiltmaker did.

FROM ASSORTED PRINTS, CUT:

- (168) 4¼" x 3" rectangles in 42 sets of 4 matching rectangles.
- FOR DARK SOLID, CUT:
 - (22) 4¼" x WOF strips. From strips, cut (168) 4¼" squares.
 - (4) 3" x WOF strips. From strips, cut (42) 3" squares.
 - (7) 2¼" x WOF strips for binding.

FROM PEACH SOLID, CUT:

- (71) Melon pieces.

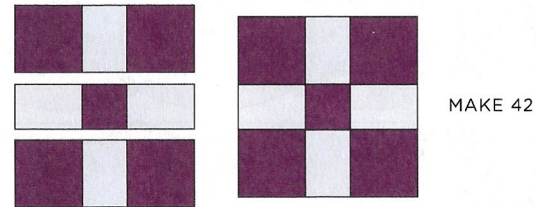
PREPARATION

Draw a horizontal and a vertical line through the center of the 11" square of template plastic. Trace the Block Unit pattern, including the straight lines, in each quadrant of the plastic square. Cut out the template on the outer line.

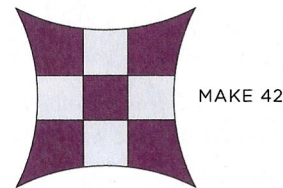
Trace the Melon pattern on the 3½" x 11" rectangle of template plastic. Cut out on the outer line.

Block Assembly

1. Lay out (4) 4¼" dark solid squares, (1) 3" dark solid square, and (4) 3" x 4¼" print rectangles. Join the pieces into rows. Press the seam allowances toward the dark side. Join the rows. Press the seam allowances away from the center to complete a Block unit. Make 42.



2. Place the plastic template on one Block unit, aligning the lines on the template with the seamlines of the Block unit, and trim around template. Repeat for remaining Block units.



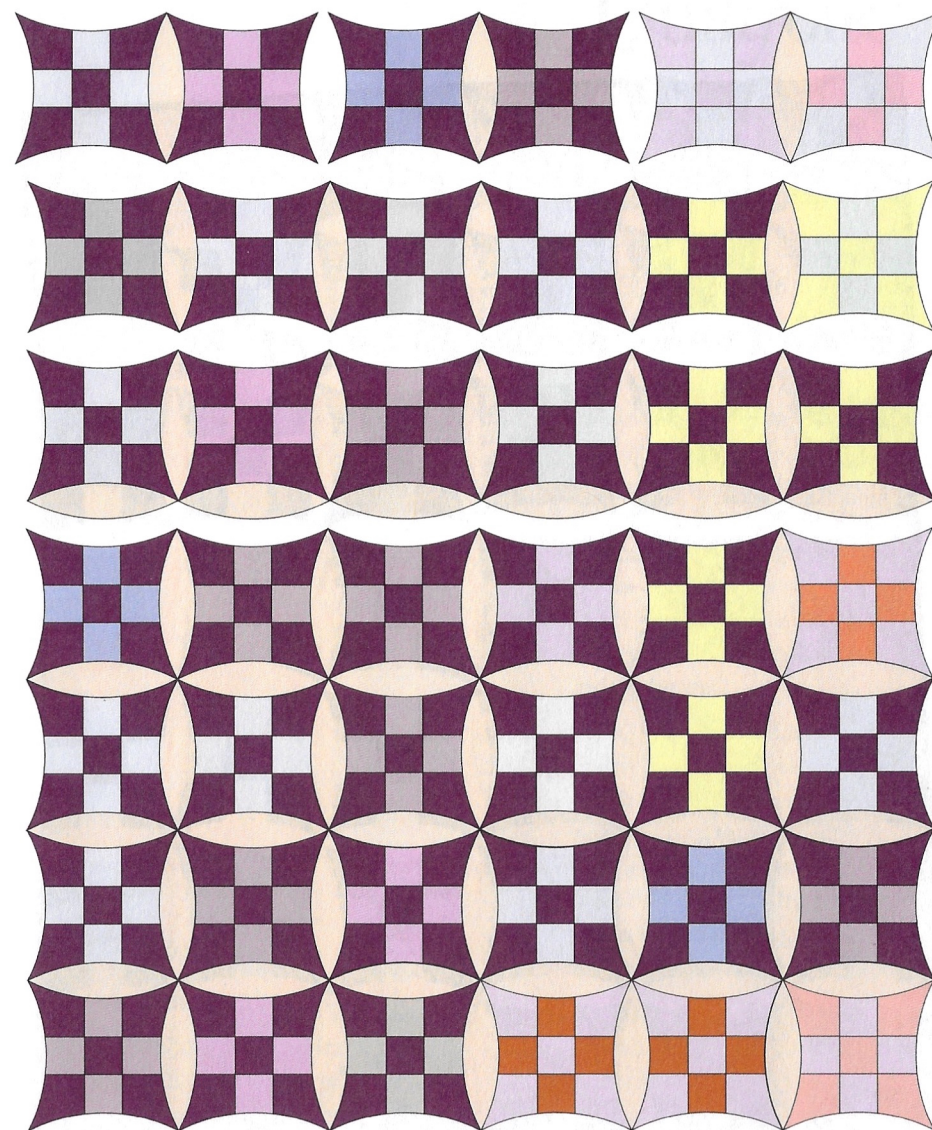
Quilt Assembly

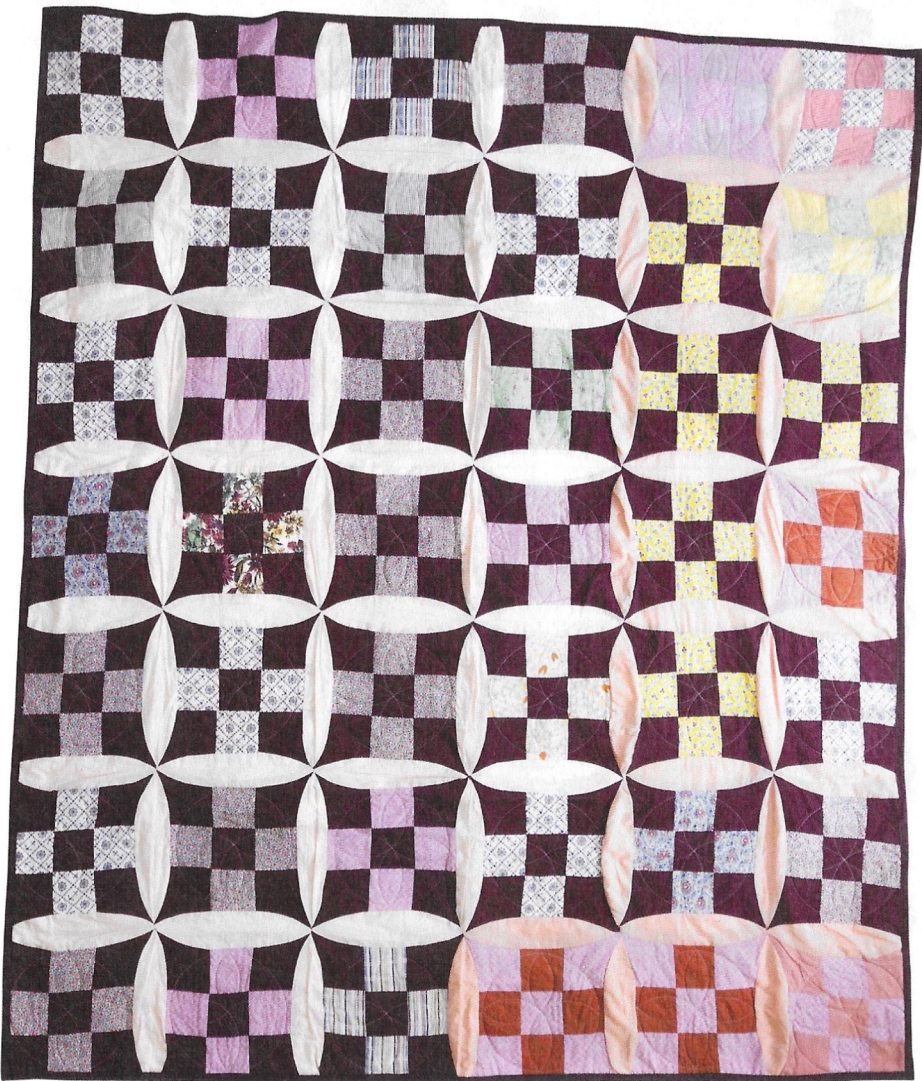
We suggest using a flannel design wall for arranging the Block units.

1. Lay out the trimmed Block units as shown in the *Quilt Assembly Diagram*.
2. Join the first and second Block units with a peach solid Melon piece between them. Repeat for the third and fourth units, and then the fifth and sixth units to make 3 pairs.
3. Join the pairs with peach solid Melon pieces between them to complete Row 1.
4. Repeat for the remaining 6 rows.
5. Sew 6 Melon pieces to the bottom of each of rows 1–6.
6. Join the rows to complete the quilt top.
7. Referring to the quilt photo, trim the edges even with the center piece in each block.

Finishing

1. Cut backing fabric into (2) $1\frac{7}{8}$ -yard lengths. Join the pieces lengthwise. The seam will run widthwise.
2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top. Baste for hand quilting or pin baste for quilting on your domestic machine.
3. Sew binding strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open and then press the binding strip in half lengthwise. Add binding to the quilt using your favorite method.
